Placing a service call


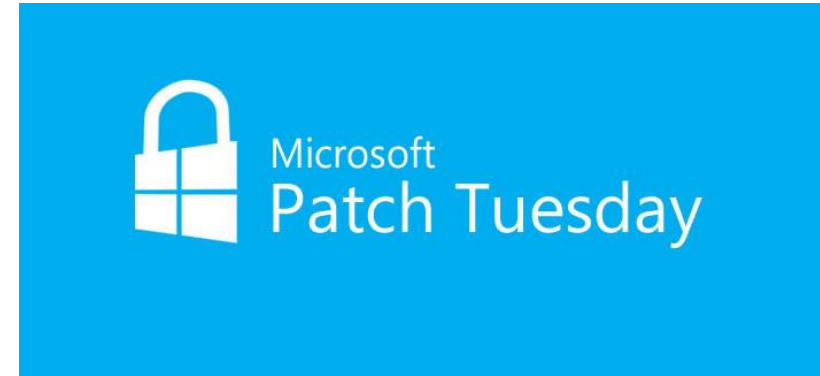
Call **888-446-7781** or any of the local Tyco Integrated Security office phone numbers. When prompted, press "3" for the Service Department. During regular business hours you will be connected to one of our Regional Service Coordinators.

Please describe the following items when placing a service call:

- Company Name
- Your name (please be sure the caller is authorized to place such calls)
- Your phone number
- The address where the service is required (please include zip code)
- The name & phone number of the site contact-if necessary
- The purpose for the service call (please try to be as specific as possible)

After your call information has been entered, the dispatcher in the region of the call is notified of the new incident and will contact you (or the site contact) to schedule service.

After-hours, weekends & holidays, dial the same numbers as listed above. After selecting option "3" for service, customers will have the option to select "1" for an emergency call or "2" for next day service.

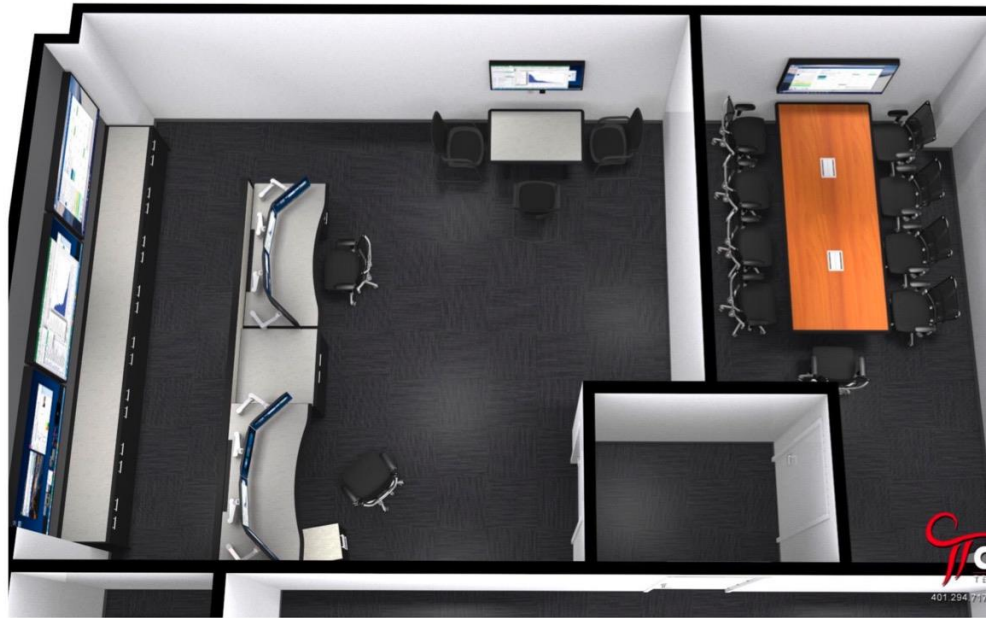

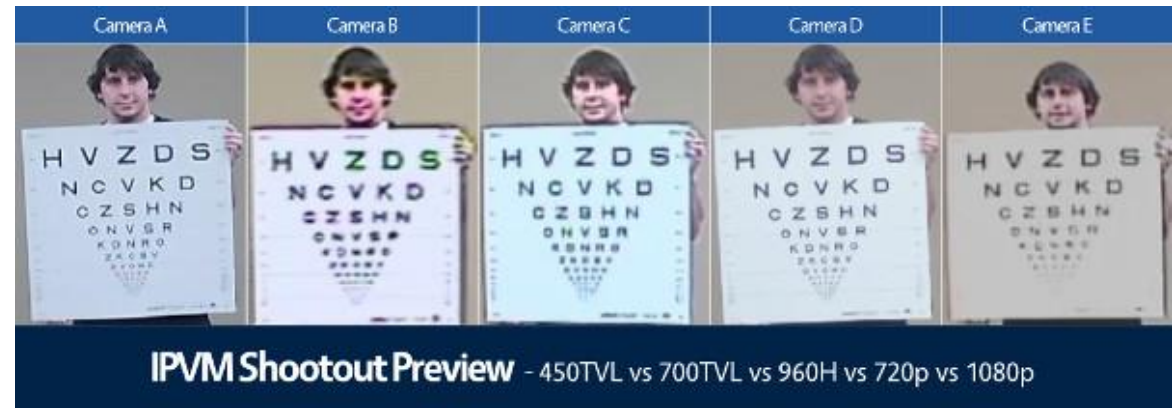

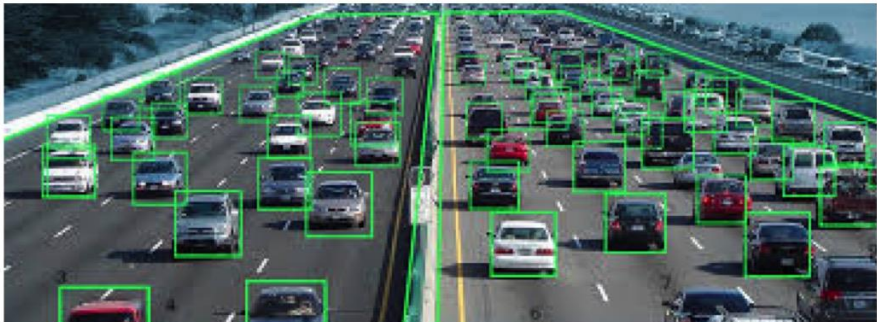
